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What is Nursing?

- Nursing is a healthcare profession focused on patient care.
- Promotes health, prevents illness, and supports recovery.

What is Midwifery?

- person, typically a woman, who is trained to assist women in childbirth
- Midwifery deals with pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum care.
- Ensures safe maternal and neonatal health.

Roles of Nurses

- Provide direct patient care.
- Administer medications and treatments.
- Coordinate with healthcare teams.

Roles of Midwives

- Assist childbirth.
- Monitor fetal and maternal health.
- Provide prenatal and postnatal education.
- ❖ prenatal period is the time from fertilization to birth, during which a fertilized egg develops into a fetus
- ❖ postnatal period is the time immediately following childbirth, typically considered to be the first six to eight weeks until the mother's body returns to its pre-pregnant state
